



March 2014 Block of the Month

Capital T

12" finished block



Fabric Colors: Violet, Orange and Green with a neutral (tan, white, etc.) background fabric.



The diagram at left gives suggested value placement of the fabric colors (value = the lightness or darkness of a color) OR be creative and change the values around.

- 1 = Medium Value
- 2 = Dark Value
- 3 = Medium Light Value
- 4 = Neutral Background Fabric

Cutting Instructions

Fabric 1 = Cut 1 square 4-1/2"

Cut 2 squares each 4-7/8" and divide in half diagonally once

Fabric 2 = Cut 8 squares each 2-7/8"


Fabric 3 = Cut 1 square 5-1/4"

Fabric 4 = Cut 2 squares each 4-7/8" and divide in half diagonally once. Cut 1 square 5-1/4"

Sewing Sequence


Flying Geese Units: following steps 1 thru 4 below, use the 5-1/4" sq. of # 3 and four 2-7/8" sqs. of #2 for one set of 4 geese units. Repeat steps 1 thru 4 below, using the 5-1/4" sq. of # 4 and four 2-7/8" sqs. of #2 for the second set of 4 geese units. In the diagrams below, blue = the 5-1/4" square & white = the 2-7/8" squares.

1. **Diagram 1 below:** Having right sides together, place two 2-7/8" squares on the 5-1/4" square. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.
2. **Diagram 2 below:** Cut the units apart on the drawn line and press toward the small #2 fabric triangles.
3. **Diagram 3 below:** Having right sides together, place a 2-7/8" square on each of the units from step 2, draw a diagonal line as shown and sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.
4. **Diagram 4 below:** Cut the units apart on the drawn line and press toward the small #2 fabric triangles. You will now have 4 Geese units.



5. Sew the geese units together as shown in diagram. Press toward the #3 fabric unit.
6. Sew the Fabric 1 & 4 triangles together to form a square. Press to the Fabric 1 triangle.
7. Sew the units into rows. (Refer to the block diagram above. Press rows 1 & 3 away from the geese units. Press row 2 to the center Fabric 1 square.
8. Sew the rows together for your finished block.
