

Sierra Quilt Guild 30th Anniversary Challenge Quilt Block 6

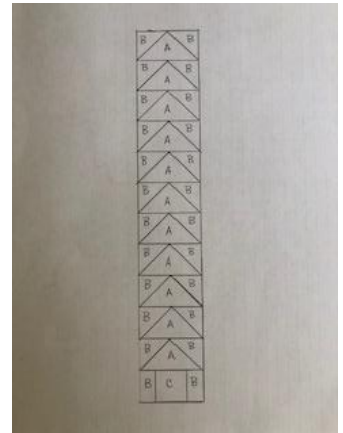
The completed block measures 4 ½" x 25 unfinished (4" x 24 ½" finished)

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A: Three (3) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares (Goose)

Fabric B: Twelve (12) 3" x 3" (Wings)
Two (2) 1 ½" x 1 ¾" rectangles

Fabric C: One (1) 2" x 1 ½" rectangle



Step 1 – Making the Flying Geese units

You will need 11 flying geese units. *Note: The method described below will make 12 flying geese units.*



Draw diagonal lines on the wrong side of the “wing” (3” x 3”) squares.

Place two (2) of the 3” x 3” squares on one (1) of the “geese” (5 ½” x 5 ½”) squares.

Stitch ¼” on each side of the diagonal line.



Cut between the stitch lines.

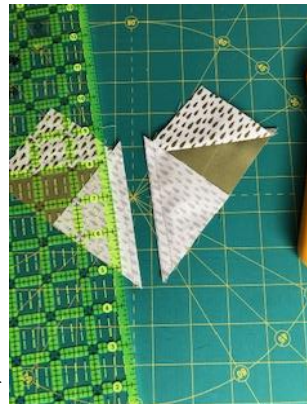
Press open.



Place the other marked 3” x 3” square as shown here.

Stitch ¼” on both sides of the diagonal line.

Cut between the stitched lines





Press open and trim to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Take 11 of the flying geese units and sew together in a strip. Press seams up.



Lastly, make the "trunk" unit by sewing the two (2) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{3}{4}$ " **Fabric B** rectangles to either side of the 2 " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " **Fabric C** rectangle. Press open.

Sew the **B/C/B** unit to the bottom of your flying geese strip. Press.
